The Skills List which identifies the qualifications that are eligible for a government subsidy under Smart and Skilled has been updated as of 1 January 2022. Developed through extensive industry and community consultation and labour market research, the Skills List includes a wide range of qualifications to support the diverse skills needs of NSW employers.

AgCAREERSTART



AgCAREERSTART is an Australian Government initiative, delivered by the National Farmers' Federation in collaboration with leading industry bodies. It is a structured gap-year program that introduces young Australians, school leavers and those under

the age of 25 to a career in agriculture. Matching participating farming businesses with young Australians, the on-farm placements over 10-12 months provide participants with a paid job, training and development and the ability to build networks within the agriculture industry.

Farm businesses employing participants will receive a \$2000 grant for participating in the program and the young person will be given a grant to complete a VET course relevant to their farm placement and interest. Young Australians will have the opportunity to learn in such jobs as farm-labour, soil testing, crop monitoring, pest and disease management, animal management and medicine. As well as working on-farm and studying their VET course, participants will be encouraged to attend significant industry events such as the NFF Conference, AgFest, AgQUIP and more.

Any Australian farming business can apply, with the first on-farm placements to commence in March 2022.

AgSkilled 2.0


AFAM continues to work as part of the AgSkilled 2.0 Steering Committee which is made up of industry representatives from cotton, grains, production horticulture, viticulture and rice-growing industries. Funded by the NSW government, Agskilled 2.0 provides fully funded accredited training to meet industry skills needs across four key training pillars: Production, Technology, Business and Safety. AFAM will continue to work with the committee throughout 2022 to provide industry input on training and workforce development needs.

To date there have been a number of successful employment outcomes for students who have trained through AgSkilled 2.0. Outcomes have included the majority of training students, who are existing workers, achieving an improved employment status such as gaining a promotion, wage increases or both within six months of course completion. These beneficial outcomes, made possible from \$15 million of NSW government funding, are available to industry and its current and future employees today.
