Thoroughbred Industry Programs to Address Skill Shortages

Last month AFAM and Skills Impact visited the Thoroughbred Breeders Australia (TBA), Thoroughbred Breeders NSW (TBNSW) and Hunter Thoroughbred Breeders Association (HTBA) to learn more about some of their innovative programs addressing industry skill shortages.

Skills Impact updated the <u>horse breeding qualifications</u> in 2019 and the qualifications were registered on the <u>National Training Register</u> in September 2019.

The industry is collaborating with a wide range of local and international stakeholders to develop and promote rewarding training and career opportunities for people interested in the horse industry.

The Thoroughly Schooled, EquiStart and Fast Track programs are three initiatives designed to attract talented young people to the sector, followed by a formal education pathway to develop and retain a skilled workforce into the future.

Smart and Skilled Updates

Extension of Fee Free Apprenticeship Initiative

The Fee Free Apprenticeship (FFA) Initiative has been extended for an additional year for all eligible enrolments until 30 June 2023. The NSW Government will continue to pay providers the full Smart and Skilled qualification price for all eligible

NSW apprentices, including school-based apprentices, who are funded under Smart and Skilled and who commenced subsidised training on or after 1 July 2018, remain eligible for fee free apprenticeships under the FFA.

The <u>NSW Skills List</u> and the <u>Smart and Skilled Prices and Fees Schedule</u> have each been updated. **Version 13.1** is now available and will be effective as of **1 July 2022**.

North Coast Flood Recovery Support Package for Learners, Trainees and Apprentices

Grants are available to learners, trainees, apprentices and school-based apprentices and trainees (SBATs) in the flood-affected North Coast under the Vocational Education Hardship Fund and Apprentice and Trainee Support grant. The grants of either \$500 or \$1000 are available to help replace training materials and assist with learners' recovery from the floods.

The grants provide financial support to learners working, living or studying in the LGAs of Ballina, Byron, the Clarence Valley, Lismore, Kyogle, the Richmond Valley and Tweed who are government-funded vocational education and training (VET) Smart and Skilled:

- learners
- · apprentices
- trainees
- · SBATs.

Applications will be accepted in-person at the NSW Recovery Service Centres from 14 June to 4 July 2022. Applications returned by mail will continue to remain open until 9 December 2022.

Careers NSW



<u>Careers NSW</u> was created following a recommendation from the NSW VET sector review led by David Gonski AC and Professor Peter Shergold AC. It aims to provide career guidance to all NSW residents at any stage in their career.

The Careers NSW pilot, launched in November 2021, has over 92,000 users already registered. It is one of the latest services introduced to support and inform those people looking to start or restart their careers and is currently looking at what works well before it launches its full-service model. In the second half of 2022, the platform is expected to have state-wide coverage, an enhanced website and an expansion of services into schools.

NSW RURAL ASSISTANCE AUTHORITY STORM & FLOODS RECOVERY ASSISTANCE



The Storm and Flood Industry Recovery Program's Supply Chain Support Grants, from \$30,000 - \$100,000, are available now for the agriculture, horticulture and aquaculture industries. The grants provided by the NSW Government and co-funded by the Australian Government, are available to eligible primary producers who were affected by the NSW storms and floods that occurred from February and March 2021 onwards.

Repect for Country Job Skills Project

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures possess skills and knowledge for land and water management activities that have been developed over thousands of years. Some of these skills are described in nationally endorsed qualifications, skill sets and units that are used to equip learners for job roles. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are leading and guiding the review of national qualifications and skills standards, so that they reflect current skill needs and terminology.

Feedback collected on draft qualifications, skill sets and units has been used to inform further updates to the drafts, which are available for validation and comment until 27 June 2022.



Led by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander project partners, language within the qualifications, skill sets and units has been updated to reflect preferred terminology and promote cultural safety. Further updates have been made to reflect the latest technology and equipment, and to promote flexible delivery and career pathways.
