At end of last month, AFAM travelled to the Central West region to meet with industry stakeholders and participate in a workforce development roundtable in Orange. The roundtable, co-facilitated by Training Services NSW and Industry Training Advisory Bodies (ITABs), provided an opportunity to discuss the skills needs, employment pathways and workforce needs and challenges in the region.

Worker shortages continue to be the common theme across industries and these shortages have been exacerbated in last few years because of drought and border closures. Seasonal workers have not returned at previous rates and employers are looking at schemes such as the Pacific Labour Scheme to address the shortage of workers. Other initiatives discussed included the Local Jobs Program (LJP), which brings together expertise, resources and access to funding at the local level to accelerate reskilling, upskilling and employment pathways. The LJP is a Federal Government COVID-19 economic recovery support measure and funding has been provided to 51 employment regions including the Central West region, where the agriculture, forestry and fishing sectors are one of the highest employing industries (13.4%).

Regional Industry Engagement Partnership Officers (RIEP) highlighted the main projects being undertaken in the Central West region. RIEP officers have been supporting employers to engage with schools through an Agriculture Camp program, which aims to showcase a range of agricultural jobs to school students by taking them on industry-led site visits. The other major project being undertaken in the Central West is the development of a dedicated agriculture and horticulture facility at Forbes High School.

Women in Trades workshops



AFAM attended a Women in Trades workshop hosted by the NSW Behavioural Insights Unit (BIU) and Trade Pathways Program team. A series of consultation meetings are being run with the aim to increase the number of women apprentices in non-traditional trades. This is an important step as women are currently underrepresented in trades making up only 2% of qualified trade workers. Attendees discussed the recruitment barriers and strategies to hiring more women apprentices and trainees, improving the employer and apprentice customer journey and how solutions could be adapted for each region.

Revised implementation schedule for performance-based contract arrangements

In acknowledgement of the impact of COVID-19 on the overall market as well as on individual providers, the NSW Department of Education has reviewed the rollout of performance-based contracting for <u>Smart and Skilled</u>. The revised schedule maintains the commitment to improving student outcomes and delivering a higher quality government-subsidised VET market in NSW. Key steps will occur in the coming months including:

- sharing updated VET student outcomes snapshots
- updating the market comparison information through the Skills Compare (previously Market Comparison) tool on the Skills NSW website
- using performance data in funding allocations for the 2022-23 activity period
- the next round of provider performance assessments and high performing providers applications.

High scoring providers identified in the provider performance assessments for 2022-23 will be invited to apply for a high performing provider's contract variation, which will offer a three-year contract term and greater funding certainty.
