NSW VET Review – Consultation Phase Underway

The NSW VET review is a NSW Government commitment to restore TAFE to be the best it can be and re-skill NSW. Deep research and analysis were conducted during phase 1 of the review and form the foundation for a public-facing discussion paper being used to guide consultations in Phase 2 which is now underway.

The discussion paper supporting this consultation phase poses questions to prompt feedback and engagement across four key themes:

- Boosting student success
- Placing TAFE NSW at the heart of the system
- Delivering VET in NSW
- Preparing VET for the future.

AgTrade Apprenticeships

Improving the visibility of career pathways and enhancing the attractiveness of a career in agriculture are crucial steps in addressing the current workforce challenges faced by this industry, particularly when it comes to attracting new entrants. Skills Insight will hold a series of workshops around the country in October, as part of a consultation and research process, to discuss various options for a potential AgTrade apprenticeship model.

Recommendations for an agricultural trade pathway have been made by the [Agricultural Workforce Working Group](#), the National Agricultural Labour Advisory Committee in the [National Agriculture Workforce Strategy](#) and the National Farmers' Federation in their [2030 Roadmap](#).



AHC Improvements Project

Over the past few years, the Agriculture, Horticulture, Conservation and Land Management (AHC) Training Package has been undergoing strategic revisions to keep it in line with industry skills needs. Reviews have been made based on unit sector, rather than qualification to improve efficiency and minimise disruptions.

As a result, several qualifications and skill sets need to be updated to incorporate units of competency that have been developed or revised in recent projects, including several work health and safety and environmental care related units. Four units are proposed for deletion while 40 qualifications and 28 skill sets will be reviewed.

Skills Insight JSC has planned online information sessions to provide further information about updates to the qualifications and skills sets and how to provide feedback. The one hour sessions are planned for:

- **Tuesday 12 September, 10-11 am**
- **Thursday 14 September, 2-3 pm**
- **Wednesday 20 September, 12-1pm**
- **Thursday 21 September, 11 am - 12 pm**

Tree Felling Project

Skills Insight and ForestWorks are undertaking a project to revise three tree felling units in consultation with industry. The project focuses on the following units of competency:

- [FWPCOT2274 Fell trees manually \(basic\)](#)
- [FWPCOT3347 Fell trees manually \(intermediate\)](#)
- [FWPCOT3348 Fell trees manually \(advanced\)](#).

The project is particularly relevant for training providers, businesses and workers involved in tree felling with chainsaws. This includes forestry workers, arboriculture workers, gardeners, farm workers, and authorised personnel from fire services, state emergency services and parks and wildlife services.
