This month AFAM participated in the Central West Careers Advisers Association's annual Facts About Careers & Tertiary Studies (FACTS) Day at Charles Stuart University in Bathurst.

It was fantastic to see a strong presence of Vocational Education Training (VET) and tertiary providers and stakeholders within AFAM's coverage, including Central West Farming Systems, Harness Racing NSW, Racing NSW, TAFE NSW, Tocal College, and Apprenticeship Network Providers. Over 700 senior students and career advisers from the region's schools attended the day-long event.

While in the region, AFAM also had the opportunity to meet with the Training Services NSW team, where we discussed skills and training needs and the workforce challenges of AFAM's industry sectors. This meeting was a key outcome of Training Services NSW's ongoing efforts to connect schools with industry.

Applications are open for the Bert Evans Apprentice Scholarships. The scholarships offer financial assistance to first year apprentices in NSW who are experiencing hardship. The scholarships are designed to support eligible apprentices, including school-based apprentices, who have shown aptitude for their trade training and demonstrate a positive attitude both in the workplace and in their formal training.

A maximum of 150 scholarships are available, each worth \$5,000 per year for up to three years.

The following grants, opportunities and scholarships are available to employers and vocational learners. Follow the links for more information.

<u>Aboriginal Business Advisory Initiative:</u> support for existing Aboriginal owned and operated businesses to grow and diversify their business.

<u>Barranggirra:</u> to provide end to end support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander learners through culturally appropriate mentoring to ensure successful retention and completion of training and improved post-training employment outcomes.

<u>Free Training for Veterans:</u> to broaden their career opportunities and help transition to civilian life after service, veterans and their partners will have access to free training.

OCHRE Opportunity Hubs: aim to provide First Nations young people with the confidence and knowledge to follow a supported pathway between school and further education and/or employment through partnerships with schools, coordination of local opportunities, mentoring, support and more.

On Farm Connectivity Program: to enable primary producers in agriculture, forestry and/or fisheries to take advantage of digital agribusiness solutions to boost productivity and improve safety. Applications close 30 June 2024 or when funding is exhausted, whichever occurs first.
