Occupation Shortage List Stakeholder Survey

The 2024 Occupation Shortage List (OSL), formerly the Skills Priority List, was released by Jobs and Skills Australia (JSA) in October 2024 providing a point-in-time assessment of the shortage status of occupations in the Australian labour market.

Currently, JSA are inviting stakeholder input via a survey, that will be used to inform the development of the 2025 Occupation Shortage List.

The list assists policy makers to understand the current skills needs and informs JSA's analysis and advice on potential policy responses to shortages. Your knowledge and experience of recruitment activity in your industry can enhance the evidence base used to identify occupations in shortage.

The Stakeholder Survey is open for participation until **Friday 7 March 2025 at 5pm (AEDT)**.

A shortage exists when employers are unable to fill or have significant challenges filling vacancies or specialised skill needs within the occupation at current levels of remuneration and conditions of employment and in reasonably accessible locations. Note that for some occupations, a lack of evidence will, by default, result in the occupation being rated as 'no shortage'.

Two other occupations, listed with their ANZSCO codes, have changed classification from 'No Shortage' to 'Shortage' in NSW:

- 234314 Park Ranger
- 361114 Zookeeper

Evidence is required to support a change of classification for this year's list. Types of evidence that may be used include independent research-based data and verifiable collections of data from industry bodies. Any evidence to support a change can be forwarded to Skills Insight JSC and AFAM at any time, as we continuously provide feedback on these lists to relevant bodies. Please contact your Skills Insight Stakeholder Engagement Manager, or AFAM if your concern is NSW specific or you're not sure who to contact.
