Job role	SSAPP15 Manual Patternmaker
Job role description	Develops garment patterns manually using traditional pattern drafting techniques. The Manual Patternmaker interprets design sketches, technical specifications and measurement charts to draft paper patterns that define garment shape, structure and construction. The role works closely with designers, technical designers, product developers and sample machinists to ensure garments achieve the intended fit, proportions and manufacturability.
Performance expectations	• Draft garment patterns manually from design specifications • Interpret technical packs, sketches and measurement charts • Ensure patterns achieve correct garment fit and proportions • Amend patterns following fit reviews and development feedback • Prepare pattern sets for sample production • Collaborate with designers and technical staff during development • Maintain accurate paper pattern libraries and documentation • Support efficient garment sampling and product development

Manual pattern drafting	Draft garment patterns using traditional patternmaking methods.
Garment construction knowledge	Understand sewing techniques and garment assembly.
Fit evaluation	Assess garment fit and identify pattern adjustments.
Measurement interpretation	Work with measurement charts and garment specifications.
Pattern modification	Adjust patterns following fit sessions and sample reviews.
Fabric behaviour awareness	Understand how fabrics affect pattern shape and garment structure.
Sample collaboration	Work with sample machinists during prototype development.
Pattern documentation	Maintain paper pattern sets and technical records.
