Job role	SSAPP33 Knitting Machine Operator – Whole Garment / Seamless
Job role description	Operates computerised knitting machines used to produce whole garment or seamless knitwear products. The role involves setting up knitting programs, loading yarns, monitoring machine performance and ensuring garments are produced to required specifications. Whole garment operators work with advanced knitting technology capable of producing complete garments without seams, reducing assembly requirements and improving manufacturing efficiency.
Performance expectations	• Operate whole garment knitting machines safely and efficiently • Load yarn packages and prepare machines for knitting production • Monitor knitting programs and machine performance • Ensure garments meet design specifications and quality standards • Identify knitting faults and correct machine settings • Maintain consistent production output and minimise downtime • Follow machine safety procedures and production protocols • Maintain clean and organised machine work areas

Critical work functions	• Ensuring garments are produced accurately according to knitting programs • Maintaining consistent knitting quality and garment structure • Minimising machine downtime and production interruptions • Preventing yarn breakage and knitting defects • Supporting efficient knitwear manufacturing operations • Ensuring garments meet production and quality specifications

Fault detection	Identify knitting faults such as dropped stitches or yarn breakage.
