Job role	SSAPP36 Linking Operator
Job role description	Operates linking machines used to join knitted garment components during knitwear production. The role involves accurately aligning knitted panels such as sleeves, collars and body pieces and linking them together using specialised linking equipment. Linking Operators ensure seams are consistent, secure and aligned with garment specifications while maintaining production efficiency and quality standards.
Performance expectations	• Operate knitwear linking machines safely and efficiently • Accurately align knitted garment panels for linking • Produce consistent and secure seams during garment assembly • Identify and report knitting defects or alignment issues • Maintain required production output and quality standards • Handle delicate knitted fabrics carefully to prevent damage • Follow workplace safety and equipment operating procedures • Maintain clean and organised production work areas
Specialisation	Knitwear garment assembly, linking of knitted panels, seam alignment and finishing of knitwear garments prior to final finishing operations.
Application in other Textile, Clothing and Footwear (TCF) sectors	• Textile garment assembly environments using specialised sewing or joining techniques • Technical textile assembly where precision joining of fabric components is required • Apparel manufacturing environments requiring specialised seam finishing techniques • Garment repair and alteration services involving knitwear construction

Key tasks	• Align knitted garment panels for linking • Operate linking machines to join garment components • Adjust machine settings to suit yarn and fabric types • Inspect seams for alignment and stitch quality • Handle knitted garments carefully during assembly • Identify knitting faults or panel mismatches • Maintain linking equipment and workstations • Record production output where required
Critical work functions	• Ensuring accurate joining of knitted garment components

	• Maintaining consistent seam quality and garment appearance • Preventing distortion or damage to knitted fabrics • Supporting efficient knitwear garment assembly operations • Maintaining productivity and quality targets • Ensuring garments are ready for finishing and pressing

Seam inspection	Inspect seams for strength, alignment and consistency
Production workflow understanding	Understand garment assembly processes within knitwear production
Workplace safety	Follow WHS practices when operating textile machinery
