Job role	SSAPP39 Label Printing and Application Technician
Job role description	Prints and applies labels, tags and identification elements to garments and textile products using specialised printing and application systems to meet regulatory, branding and production requirements. In apparel production—where product identification, compliance and branding are critical—the Label Printing and Application Technician prepares label designs, operates label printing equipment and applies labels accurately to garments. The role supports integration with production, inventory and garment tracking systems.
Performance expectations	- Producing labels that meet design, regulatory and branding requirements - Maintaining accuracy in label content, placement and attachment - Operating label printing and application equipment efficiently and safely - Ensuring compliance with labelling regulations and standards - Minimising errors, rework and material waste - Meeting production targets and timelines - Ensuring correct data, barcodes and tracking information - Maintaining equipment performance and reporting faults - Following workplace safety and operational procedures - Supporting integration with production and tracking systems
