Job role	SSAPP42 Embroidery Technician
Job role description	Produces and manages embroidered designs on garments and textile products using industrial and digital embroidery systems to meet design specifications, quality standards and production requirements. In apparel production—where decoration and branding are key value-adding processes—the Embroidery Technician interprets digital and physical design requirements, prepares materials, programs and operates embroidery equipment, and ensures consistent, high-quality output aligned with production workflows and brand standards. The role reflects increasing integration of automated systems, digital design files and mass customisation processes.
Performance expectations	- Producing embroidery that meets design specifications and quality standards - Maintaining consistency in stitching, alignment, density and thread quality - Programming and operating embroidery machines efficiently and safely - Preparing garments, stabilisers and materials correctly for embroidery - Minimising defects, rework and material waste - Meeting production targets, including short-run and customised orders - Ensuring correct thread, colour matching and design execution - Maintaining equipment performance and reporting faults - Following workplace safety and operational procedures - Supporting efficient and digitally integrated production workflows
