Job role	SSAPP6 Designer – Knitwear
Job role description	Designs knitted apparel products including sweaters, cardigans, knit dresses and other knitwear garments. The Knitwear Designer develops creative concepts, stitch structures and yarn selections that define the aesthetic and technical performance of knitted garments. The role collaborates with yarn technologists, product developers, technical designers and knit technicians to ensure knitwear designs are manufacturable and aligned with brand identity and market demand.
Performance expectations	• Develop knitwear design concepts for seasonal collections • Specify stitch structures, yarn types and knit constructions • Create technical design documentation for knitwear garments • Collaborate with product developers and knit technicians • Review knitwear prototypes and development samples • Ensure knitwear products align with brand aesthetic and target markets • Refine designs based on sampling and technical feedback • Maintain accurate design files and knit specifications
Specialisation	Design of knitted garments including stitch pattern development, yarn selection and knit construction.

Garment construction awareness	Understand knitwear assembly and finishing methods.
Technical specification preparation	Prepare knitwear design specifications.
Trend analysis	Interpret fashion and knitwear market trends.
Product development collaboration	Work with knit technicians and developers.
