Job role	SSALT2 Alterations Sewing Machinist
Job role description	Performs garment alterations and repair tasks using industrial sewing machinery and hand techniques. Works from marked garments and alteration instructions provided by a Senior Specialist or Owner-Operator.
Performance expectations	• Complete alterations to required quality standards • Follow marking and alteration instructions accurately • Maintain stitching precision and seam integrity • Meet agreed turnaround times • Minimise fabric damage and rework • Maintain safe and organised workstation
Specialisation	• Hem adjustments and length alterations • Zip replacement • Seam adjustments and tapering • Basic lining repairs • General garment repairs
Application in other TCF sectors	Transferable to apparel manufacturing, tailoring workshops and costume production environments.

Key tasks	• Read and interpret alteration instructions • Prepare garments for alteration • Perform hemming, seam adjustment and resizing • Replace zips and repair seams • Operate industrial sewing machinery • Press and finish garments to presentation standard • Conduct basic quality inspection before handover
Critical work functions	• Maintaining seam strength and garment integrity • Accurate measurement and alignment • Preventing fabric distortion or damage • Ensuring consistent stitch quality • Maintaining production efficiency • Following safe machinery operating procedures • Adhering to established quality standards
