Job role	SSALT7 Footwear Machinery Technician
Job role description	Maintains, services and repairs specialist footwear repair machinery including sole presses, heel attaching machines, grinders, sanders, finishers, stretching equipment and key cutting machines. Ensures safe, reliable and high-quality operation of equipment within footwear repair workshops.
Performance expectations	• Maintain operational reliability of footwear repair machinery • Minimise equipment downtime and disruption to workflow • Ensure machinery complies with safety standards • Support consistent repair quality outcomes • Maintain accurate maintenance documentation • Respond promptly to mechanical faults and breakdowns
Specialisation	• Sole and heel pressing machinery • Grinding and finishing equipment • Stretching and reshaping equipment • Key cutting and ancillary machinery • Preventative maintenance systems
Application in other TCF sectors	Transferable to footwear production, leather goods manufacturing and small-scale manufacturing equipment maintenance roles.

2. Key tasks and critical work functions

Key tasks	• Conduct preventative maintenance on footwear machinery • Diagnose mechanical and electrical faults • Replace worn components and consumables • Adjust pressure, alignment and calibration settings • Test equipment for safe and accurate operation • Maintain spare parts inventory • Provide operational guidance to repair staff
Critical work functions	• Maintaining consistent repair quality • Ensuring safe machine operation • Minimising operational downtime • Managing equipment lifecycle and servicing schedules • Ensuring compliance with electrical and WHS standards • Supporting workshop productivity • Maintaining accurate maintenance records

Mechanical fault diagnosis	Identifying faults in presses, grinders and stretching machines.
Electrical systems knowledge*	Understanding motors, switches and safety controls.
Hydraulic and pneumatic systems	Maintaining pressure-based machinery systems.
Machine calibration	Adjusting pressure and alignment settings.
Preventative maintenance planning	Scheduling regular servicing.
Safety compliance knowledge	Ensuring machinery meets WHS requirements.
