Job role	SSALT9 Leather / Suede Garment Repair and Alteration Specialist
Job role description	Provides specialist repair, alteration and restoration services for leather and suede garments. Responsible for structural reshaping, panel replacement, stitching repairs and surface restoration. Typically found in larger studios or enterprises offering advanced material specialisation.
Performance expectations	• Deliver durable and aesthetically consistent leather repairs • Maintain garment structural integrity during alteration • Match colour, grain and texture effectively • Minimise visible repair impact • Meet agreed customer timelines • Maintain safe handling of specialist materials
Specialisation	• Leather jacket reconstruction • Suede garment reshaping • Panel replacement and patching • Lining replacement in leather garments • Surface conditioning and restoration
Application in other TCF sectors	Transferable to leather goods repair, saddlery, footwear production and artisanal leather workshops.

2. Key tasks and critical work functions

Key tasks	• Assess leather or suede garment structure • Determine feasibility of alteration or repair • Disassemble garment panels where required • Replace damaged panels or sections • Perform leather stitching and reinforcement • Condition and refinish repaired surfaces • Conduct final inspection and finishing
Critical work functions	• Maintaining leather grain and colour consistency • Ensuring structural durability of repairs • Preventing material damage during stitching • Accurate panel alignment and seam strength • Managing specialist adhesives and tools safely • Balancing aesthetic repair outcomes with structural needs • Maintaining precision in cutting and shaping

Panel replacement techniques	Structural rebuilding of damaged sections.
Cost estimation	Accurate pricing of complex leather repairs.
