Job role	SSMTC01 Project Manager [Fabrication and Systems]
Job role description	Leads and manages end-to-end fabrication and systems-based projects within the cut and sewn non-garment sector of the Textile, Clothing and Footwear (TCF) industry, ensuring that products, materials, structures and assemblies meet design intent, performance specifications and regulatory standards. In the Australian TCF industry, this role applies to sectors producing non-garment sewn products such as upholstery systems, automotive interiors, technical textile assemblies, defence equipment, industrial covers, architectural fabrics and composite textile structures. The Project Manager is responsible for coordinating all phases of product realisation including design translation, materials selection, fabrication processes, testing, compliance and delivery. A critical responsibility of this role is ensuring that fabrics, reinforcements, seams and structural systems comply with relevant Australian and international standards, including strength, durability, fire resistance, environmental exposure, safety and performance requirements. This includes overseeing testing, certification and documentation processes. The role involves managing cross-functional teams including designers, engineers, production supervisors, quality specialists and external suppliers. It requires strong capability in planning, scheduling, risk management, cost control and stakeholder communication to ensure projects are delivered on time, within scope and to required quality standards.
