Job role	SSDCL15 Laundry Worker – Soil Sort
Job role description	Sorts soiled linen and textile items by type, colour, soil level and processing requirements to prepare loads for efficient and safe washing processes. In the Australian laundry industry—where hygiene, infection control and workflow efficiency are critical—the Soil Sort Worker applies knowledge of textile categories and contamination risks to ensure correct segregation, prevent cross-contamination and support downstream washing and finishing operations.
Performance expectations	• Sorting soiled linen by fabric type, colour and soil level to meet processing requirements • Identifying contaminated or hazardous items and applying appropriate handling procedures • Segregating items to prevent cross-contamination and ensure hygiene standards • Preparing sorted loads for washing in line with batch and workflow requirements • Maintaining accurate identification and tracking of linen batches • Following workplace health, safety and infection control procedures • Maintaining cleanliness and organisation of sorting areas • Meeting production targets and throughput requirements • Coordinating with washroom and production teams to maintain workflow continuity • Contributing to continuous improvement in sorting accuracy and efficiency

Critical work functions	• Ensuring correct segregation to maintain hygiene and prevent cross-contamination • Maintaining accuracy in sorting to support effective wash outcomes • Identifying hazardous or high-risk items and applying controls • Supporting efficient workflow into washroom operations • Ensuring compliance with safety and infection control standards • Coordinating with production teams to maintain throughput
