Job role	SSDCL16 Laundry Worker – Washroom
Job role description	Operates industrial washing and drying equipment to clean linen and textile items in accordance with processing requirements, hygiene standards and production schedules. In the Australian laundry industry—where hygiene, infection control and operational efficiency are critical—the Washroom Operator applies knowledge of textiles, chemicals and machine settings to ensure effective cleaning outcomes while maintaining fabric integrity and supporting continuous production workflows.
Performance expectations	• Operating industrial washers, extractors and dryers to achieve required cleaning outcomes • Selecting appropriate wash programs, temperatures and chemical dosing levels • Monitoring machine cycles and adjusting settings as required • Maintaining hygiene standards and preventing cross-contamination • Ensuring compliance with workplace health, safety and chemical handling procedures • Maintaining accurate batch identification and tracking systems • Meeting production targets and turnaround requirements • Coordinating with soil sort and finishing teams to maintain workflow continuity • Maintaining cleanliness and operational readiness of equipment and work areas • Contributing to continuous improvement in cleaning efficiency and quality

Critical work functions	- Ensuring correct wash processes for different textile types - Maintaining hygiene standards and preventing cross-contamination - Managing chemical dosing safely and effectively - Maintaining consistent cleaning outcomes across batches - Ensuring safe operation of equipment and processes - Coordinating workflow with upstream and downstream processes
