Job role	SSDCL4 Laundry Operator [Dry Cleaning]
Job role description	Performs commercial laundry operations including sorting, washing, drying and basic finishing of textile items to achieve required cleanliness, hygiene and presentation standards. In the Australian laundry and dry cleaning industry—where operations must comply with workplace health, safety and environmental requirements—the Laundry Operator applies knowledge of textiles, detergents and machine settings to ensure efficient processing, fabric care and consistent quality outcomes.
Performance expectations	• Sorting laundry items based on fabric type, colour and processing requirements • Selecting appropriate wash programs, detergents and chemical dosing levels • Operating industrial washing and drying equipment to achieve required outcomes • Monitoring machine performance and adjusting settings as required • Maintaining textile quality, hygiene standards and fabric integrity • Ensuring compliance with workplace health, safety and chemical handling procedures • Meeting production targets and turnaround times • Maintaining accurate workflow and batch tracking systems • Supporting finishing and dispatch processes where required • Contributing to continuous improvement in efficiency, quality and sustainability

Key tasks	• Sorting laundry by fabric type, colour and soil level • Loading and unloading industrial washers and dryers • Selecting and setting wash programs and chemical dosing • Monitoring wash cycles and machine performance • Transferring items between washing, drying and finishing stages • Conducting basic quality checks on cleaned items • Maintaining cleanliness of machines and work areas • Following workplace health, safety and chemical handling procedures
Critical work functions	• Ensuring correct wash processes for different textile types • Maintaining hygiene and cleanliness standards • Preventing fabric damage during washing and drying • Managing workflow to meet production schedules • Ensuring safe handling of chemicals and equipment • Coordinating with production and finishing teams

Chemical handling	Managing detergents and dosing systems safely

Equipment maintenance	Performing basic cleaning and maintenance of machines
