Job role description	Designs, implements and optimises environmentally sustainable cleaning systems and processes within dry cleaning operations, including wet cleaning / liquid carbon dioxide, silicone based solvent and biodegradable solvent systems and energy-efficient equipment. Applies knowledge of textile care, chemical systems and environmental practices to reduce impact while maintaining cleaning performance. In the Australian dry cleaning industry—where operations must comply with environmental regulations and sustainability expectations—the role supports reduced emissions, improved resource efficiency and responsible chemical use, working closely with production, maintenance and management teams.
