Job role	SSFOT06 Footwear Machine Operator (Closing)
Job role description	Operates industrial sewing and closing machinery to assemble footwear uppers from pre-cut components. Ensures accurate stitching, alignment and reinforcement in accordance with technical specifications and quality standards prior to lasting and assembly.
Performance expectations	• Achieve daily upper assembly output targets • Maintain high stitching accuracy and alignment • Ensure consistency with technical specifications • Minimise rework and defects • Operate machinery safely and efficiently • Maintain accurate production records
Specialisation	• Flat-bed and post-bed sewing machines • Specialist stitching and decorative finishes • Reinforcement and binding operations
Application in other Textile, Clothing and Footwear (TCF) sectors	Transferable to stitching and assembly roles in leather goods, apparel and textile manufacturing sectors.

Key tasks	• Set up and operate closing machinery • Assemble upper components according to patterns • Ensure correct seam allowances and reinforcement • Inspect stitching quality and alignment • Adjust machine settings for different materials • Record output and report defects • Maintain clean and safe workstation
Critical work functions	• Maintaining stitching precision and durability • Ensuring seam integrity and alignment • Supporting workflow continuity to lasting stage • Reducing material waste and rework • Maintaining consistent production standards • Adhering to safety procedures • Identifying material or construction defects early

Upper assembly techniques	Apply correct stitching sequences and reinforcement methods.
Thread and needle selection	Select appropriate thread types and machine settings.
Material handling	Handle leather, synthetics and textiles appropriately.
Quality inspection procedures	Inspect seams for strength and visual quality.
Basic machine maintenance	Perform routine adjustments and cleaning.
Digital production reporting*	Record output in ERP or production tracking systems.
WHS compliance	Follow safety procedures for machinery use.
