Job role description	Constructs, repairs and maintains saddles and related equestrian leather products. Performs cutting, shaping, stitching, assembly, fitting and finishing to high standards of durability, safety and craftsmanship.
Performance expectations	- Produce saddlery products meeting durability and safety standards - Maintain high craftsmanship and finish - Ensure accurate saddle fit and balance - Minimise material waste and rework - Comply with WHS and quality procedures - Meet custom and production deadlines
