Job role	SSLPR23 Saddle Assembler
Job role description	Assembles saddle components into completed saddles in accordance with technical specifications. Works with prepared leather parts, trees, panels and hardware to ensure structural integrity, balance and finish quality.

Critical work functions	• Precision alignment and balance • Secure hardware installation • Inspection of assembled components • Adherence to technical specifications • Consistent quality and finish

Tool operation	Use hand tools and assembly equipment.
Safety compliance	Apply WHS procedures in workshop settings.
