Job role	SSLPR25 Saddle Repairer
Job role description	Diagnoses, repairs and restores saddles and equestrian leather products. Performs structural repairs, component replacement, stitching restoration and refinishing to ensure safety, durability and performance.
Performance expectations	- Restore saddles to safe and functional condition - Maintain structural integrity and balance - Deliver high-quality repair workmanship - Accurately diagnose defects and wear - Meet customer turnaround expectations - Comply with WHS and quality standards
Specialisation	- Saddle structural repair - Panel and flocking restoration - Hardware replacement and reinforcement - Vintage and heritage saddle restoration

Key tasks	- Inspect and diagnose saddle damage - Disassemble damaged components - Repair or replace leather panels and parts - Restitch seams and reinforce stress points - Replace hardware and fittings - Refinish surfaces and apply edge treatments - Reassemble and test structural balance
Critical work functions	- Structural safety and integrity - Precision in repair alignment - Durability of restored components - Secure hardware installation - High standard of finish - Customer satisfaction and reliability
