1. Job role

TCF sub-sector	Leather Production
Functional area	Leather Production
Job role	SSLPR9 Leather Production Operator - Tanning
Job role description	Responsible for converting prepared hides into stable leather through chrome or alternative tanning processes. Operates large tanning drums, controls chemical addition, monitors penetration and fixation stages, and ensures even tanning results. Requires strong mechanical control of rotating vessels and understanding of chemical interaction with hide fibres.
Performance expectations	• Achieve production targets without compromising leather quality • Maintain correct machine settings and process parameters • Operate machinery safely within WHS requirements • Minimise defects, waste and rework • Ensure consistent preparation for downstream processes
Specialisation	May specialise in specific machinery or process stages.
Application in other Textile, Clothing and Footwear (TCF) sectors	Transferable to textile dyeing operations, technical textile wet processing and industrial batch-processing environments involving rotating vessels.

2. Key tasks and critical work functions

Key tasks	• Load and unload hides into tanning drums following safe lock-out procedures • Measure and charge tanning chemicals according to production sheets • Monitor drum rotation, float ratios, pH and temperature throughout cycle • Inspect leather for penetration and fixation consistency • Clean drums and work areas between batches • Coordinate batch completion with retanning stage
Critical work functions	• Safe operation of large rotating vessels • Accurate chemical dosing and reaction control • Monitoring and adjustment of process parameters • Early detection of uneven tanning or mechanical faults • Compliance with WHS and chemical safety standards

3. Technical skills

Tanning drum operation	Operate and monitor large tanning drums; control rotation speed, float ratios and cycle timing.
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Chemical charging and handling	Measure and introduce tanning agents safely; monitor reaction stages.
Process control	Monitor pH, temperature and tanning duration to achieve consistent fibre stabilisation.
Mechanical inspection	Identify drum imbalance, leakage or mechanical faults.
Maintenance support	Assist with cleaning and routine drum inspection.

Teamwork	Works effectively within production teams.
Communication	Reports faults, quality issues and safety risks clearly.
Problem solving	Responds to process or machinery irregularities.
Learning	Builds proficiency in machinery setup and process control.
Initiative	Supports yield improvement and waste reduction.
Service / customer orientation	Understands impact of role on final leather performance and customer requirements.

Emerging skills	• Use of electronic work orders and digital batch instructions to confirm tanning specifications, chemical sequences and processing times • Interaction with visual display units (VDUs) and touch-screen drum control panels to monitor rotation speed, float ratios, pH, temperature and cycle progression • Operation of automated or semi-automated chemical dosing systems to improve accuracy and reduce manual handling risks • Monitoring of in-drum pH and temperature sensors linked to automated process control systems • Application of chrome-reduced, metal-free and environmentally sustainable tanning chemistries • Increased understanding of water-reduction and energy-efficiency practices within tanning processes • Greater traceability and documentation requirements linking tanning batches to export standards and downstream processing stages • Adaptation to integrated production scheduling systems that coordinate tanning with beamhouse, retanning and finishing operations
