Job role	SSNST10 Finishing Machinist
Job role description	Supports the finishing, presentation, inspection and preparation of woven and finished textile products within textile manufacturing operations to ensure products meet quality, presentation and customer specifications. In the Australian textile manufacturing industry—where product quality, consistency, textile durability and presentation standards are critical—the Finishing Machinist - Textile Fabric Production is responsible for performing post-production finishing operations on woven textile products including woollen blankets, scarves, furnishing textiles and technical fabrics. The role supports production efficiency by inspecting, repairing, finishing and preparing textile products for dispatch while maintaining product quality and workplace safety standards. The role commonly supports finishing operations following weaving, washing, milling, dyeing, brushing and pressing processes. Finishing machinists work with industrial sewing and textile finishing equipment to complete edge finishing, binding, hemming, trimming, labelling and repair activities while ensuring products comply with workplace quality and presentation requirements.
Performance expectations	- Inspecting woven textile products for faults, loose threads, damage and finishing defects - Performing hemming, edge binding, overlocking and reinforcement stitching operations - Operating industrial sewing, overlocking and textile finishing equipment safely - Repairing weaving and finishing defects in woollen and woven textile products - Supporting brushing, pressing, steaming and fabric presentation processes - Attaching labels, care instructions, RFID tags and identification markings - Trimming excess fibres, threads and unfinished textile edges - Folding, packaging and preparing finished textile products for dispatch - Maintaining workplace cleanliness and equipment safety standards - Meeting textile finishing quality and production targets

Key tasks	• Inspecting woven textile products for weaving faults, stains, holes and finishing defects • Performing hemming, edge stitching and blanket binding operations • Operating industrial sewing machines, overlockers and textile finishing equipment • Repairing damaged seams, selvages and woven fabric defects • Supporting brushing, steaming, pressing and shaping operations • Trimming loose threads, fibres and unfinished edges • Folding, packaging and preparing finished products for dispatch • Attaching labels, care instructions and product identification tags • Maintaining finishing equipment and work areas in safe operating condition • Following workplace health, safety and textile handling procedures
Critical work functions	• Maintaining textile quality, appearance and presentation standards • Preventing defective products from entering dispatch and distribution • Supporting production efficiency through timely finishing operations • Ensuring consistency in textile finishing and product preparation • Supporting safe handling of textile products and machinery • Adapting to varying textile types, production volumes and customer specifications

Textile inspection	Identifying weaving faults, damage, loose threads, stains and finishing inconsistencies in woven textile products
Industrial sewing	Operating sewing machines, overlockers and edge finishing equipment safely and efficiently

Edge finishing	Performing hemming, binding, overlocking and reinforcement stitching operations
Textile repair	Repairing minor weaving defects, damaged seams and selvages
Pressing and steaming	Applying pressing and steaming techniques to improve textile presentation and shape
Textile handling	Applying correct handling techniques for woollen and woven textile products
Packaging preparation	Folding, labelling and preparing finished textile products for dispatch
Workflow coordination	Supporting production continuity between finishing, inspection and dispatch areas
