Job role	CS25 Sewing Machine Technician
Job role description	Maintains, services and repairs industrial sewing machines and related equipment used in clothing and footwear production and repair. Ensures machines operate safely, efficiently and to required quality standards. Typically, present in medium enterprises or servicing multiple small businesses.
Performance expectations	• Maintain optimal machine performance and reliability • Minimise equipment downtime • Ensure machines meet safety standards • Support quality stitching performance • Maintain accurate service and maintenance records • Respond promptly to repair requests
Specialisation	• Industrial lockstitch and overlock machines • Heavy-duty leather and footwear machines • Walking foot and post-bed machines • Motor and drive systems • Preventative maintenance programs
Application in other TCF sectors	The skills described in this profile are transferable across multiple sectors of the textile, clothing and footwear (TCF) industry and may also be applied in other manufacturing and product-based industries where similar capabilities are required.

Key tasks	• Conduct preventative maintenance on sewing machines • Diagnose and repair mechanical faults • Adjust machine timing and tension settings • Replace worn components and parts • Test machines for stitching quality • Maintain maintenance logs and documentation • Provide basic user guidance to operators
Critical work functions	• Maintaining consistent stitch quality • Ensuring safe machine operation • Minimising production disruption • Managing spare parts inventory • Maintaining compliance with electrical and safety standards • Supporting operator efficiency • Extending equipment lifespan

Machine calibration	Adjusting tension, timing and feed systems.

Safety compliance knowledge	Ensuring machines meet safety standards.
